Dear Parent or Legal Guardian,

A student in the Washington Township School District has recently been diagnosed with hand, foot, and mouth disease. This is a mild viral infection common in young children characterized by sores in the mouth and a rash on the hands and feet. The most common cause of hand-foot-and-mouth disease is infection with the coxsackievirus A16.

A person usually gets sick with coxsackievirus disease within 1 to 5 days after being infected. A fever is often the first sign of hand-foot-and-mouth disease, followed by a sore throat and sometimes a poor appetite and malaise (feeling unwell). Other symptoms may blister like lesions on the tongue, gums, and inside of cheeks, red rash, and irritability.

Any child with a fever should not attend school. If your child develops a fever, please do not send them to school until they are fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medications.

If your child has any symptoms of this disease, call your doctor or other healthcare provider to find out what to do.
