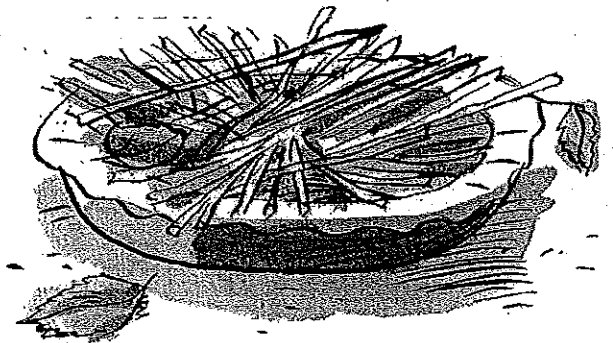
Summer Fashion Review
