It is understood that the county prosecutor, working in conjunction with the county superintendent, pursuant to NJAC 6A:16-6.2(b)15, shall not less than once each calendar year, organize and conduct a meeting of representatives from the law enforcement and educational communities to discuss the implementation of and compliance with the provisions of this Agreement, pursuant to NJAC 6A-6.2(b)12, throughout the county, to discuss any other matters of mutual concern, and to recommend revisions to this Agreement, insofar as, pursuant to NJAC 6A:16-6.2(b)15ii, the revisions are in addition to and do not conflict with the format and content established by the Attorney General and the Commissioner of Education and that are in addition to and do not conflict with the policies and procedures established pursuant to NJAC 6A:16-6.

A description of the program and a list of teachers they will be visiting is as follows, as recommended by the Superintendent. RCV:

Peer Leadership is a full-year training course AND extra-curricular program for students interested in serving as peer leaders during their senior year. Participants will study models designed to promote positive influence on the behavior, ideas, attitudes, and decisions of students in our school community. The course is taught by trained faculty, with significant portions of the class dedicated to actual group experience. Acceptance into the course is dependent on the selection process by a faculty committee. The criteria are: academics; leadership qualities or potential for leadership; dynamism; respect of teachers and peers; disciplinary record; demonstrated willingness to work with all members of the school community regardless of gender, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, socio-economic class, clique, or cultural sub-group; evidence of high moral character. To be considered for acceptance to the program, students must register for the class with their guidance counselors. Under normal circumstances, students will be notified about their acceptance or rejection to the program no later than the last day of school. All students selected for this program will be required to attend mandatory summer training at the high school from 9:00 AM until 3:00 PM, June 20-21, 2011.
