Participants will study models designed to promote positive influence on the behavior, ideas, attitudes, and decisions of students in our school community. The course is taught by trained faculty, with significant portions of the class dedicated to actual group experience. Acceptance into the course is dependent on the selection process by a faculty committee. The criteria are: academics: leadership qualities or potential for leadership; dynamism; respect of teachers and peers; disciplinary record; demonstrated willingness to work with all members of the school community regardless of gender, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, socio-economic class, clique, or cultural sub-group; evidence of high moral character. To be considered for acceptance to the program, students must register for the class with their guidance counselors. Under normal circumstances, students will be notified about their acceptance or rejection to the program no later than the last day of school. All students

selected for this program will be required to attend mandatory summer training at the high school.
