Anyone can learn how to use naloxone to save a life during an opioid overdose. It quickly reverses the effects of opioids.

Training includes how to administer naloxone and rescue breathing. The training will be held via Webex video conference and runs approximately 60 to 90 minutes.

FREE naloxone kits will be sent to training attendees.

You can register if you are a family member, friend, professional or individual who is at risk, or could be in the presence of someone at risk, for an overdose.
