CAT students will experience the following curriculum tracks:

Fundamentals for Success:

Career Exploration, Employment Ethics & Soft Skill Training, Resume Writing, Job Application Completion and Career Preparation, Job Interviewing, On-the-job-Training, and Job Coaching

Specialized Career Exploration:

Customer Service, Food Service, Animal Caretaking, Hospitality/Tourism, and more!

The CAT program is for **individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities** between the ages of 18-24, residing in Warren County. *Tuition is waived for the 2022 - 2023 school year.*
Program Hours: Monday - Friday, 9:00 am - 2:30 pm.
