Our school district continues to utilize a subscription to a research-based standards mastery program called Study Island. This online subscription is completely Web-based, which allows students to access the program from any computer with an Internet connection using a standard Web browser.

The program is divided into sections based on subject (Mathematics & Reading). Each section includes 15 to 30 topics, with each topic containing approximately 20 to 30 questions. Topics are accompanied by a lesson, which contains a brief overview of the material covered in that topic.

Students are strongly encouraged to use the Study Island subscription while at home. Each week, we will run reports to determine which Brass Castle and Port Colden students have completed the most at-home lessons and those scores will be tabulated by homeroom. A blue ribbon will be awarded to the homeroom that showed the greatest at-home use.

Log in to help your class earn the blue ribbon for Study Island at home!

Instructions to use the program:

- ◇ Go to [www.studyisland.com](http://www.studyisland.com)
- ◇ Enter your username and password at the upper left side of the screen, and click "Submit." Students will receive a username and password from school.
- ◇ Click on a subject (math, reading, etc.).
- ◇ If this is the first time using the program, click "Pretest."
- ◇ You must complete 10 Pretest questions to unlock the rest of the content in that subject. If there is no Pretest option, or if you have already taken the Pretest, you may move on to the other content topics.
- ◇ Choose a Session Type. The default setting is Practice Mode, however students may also select Printable Worksheet or Game Model if permitted by the school.
- ◇ To pass a topic, you must meet the passing requirements, which are based on a minimum number of questions answered (usually 10) and a minimum percentage correct (around 70%). A blue ribbon icon is displayed next to all passed topics.
- ◇ Once you have completed the Pretest, you may work through the remainder of the topics in any order. You must pass all topics before taking the Post Test. Once you have passed all the topics, you must pass the Post Test to complete the subject. Ignore this step if the subject has no Post Test.

## Fire Prevention Week

Fire Prevention Week is from Oct. 7th to 11th, and the students at Port Colden are looking forward to our annual visit from the Washington Township Fire Department. Each year we partner with the fire department to review important safety tips in fire prevention. Students are reminded to change the batteries in their smoke alarms twice a year, and to make sure that they plan a family meeting place in the event of an emergency. Local firefighters also dress in full gear in order to show the students how they look and the sounds they make when they are dressed to battle a fire. We don't want our little ones to ever be afraid of firemen during a real emergency. Students are also made aware of all the safety equipment that our firemen use from their gear to their truck. Touring the truck is always a highlight of the day. Please be sure to discuss this exciting day with your children and don't forget to practice fire safety at home.

## School Bus Evacuation Drills



School Bus evacuations are held twice a year to ensure that students are prepared in case of an emergency while riding on their school bus. Our fall drill was held on Tuesday, October 1st. The drills were held during morning arrival.

The drill consisted of teaching the children to exit the rear bus door properly. Students were reminded that they needed to remain quiet in order to hear the driver's instructions. Older children, that typically sit in the rear of the bus, were instructed how to open the rear emergency door and how to assist the other children off the bus. Students were to file out the rear door in single file by rows. Exiting students were told to sit down in the rear exit doorway and then slide off the floor of the bus to the ground. Two students were stationed on the ground at the emergency door along with a staff member to ensure that children safely exited the bus. As the students exited the bus they were told to move away from the bus and line up for further instructions.

Students were not permitted to take any of their belongings with them during the evacuation. After the drill was over, the children were loaded back onto the bus to collect their belongings and proceed into the school.

## 2013—2014 Club Program

**After School Fall Sports-BC** — Students will participate in a safe, fun, educational environment where they can expand their knowledge of basketball by participating in a variety of drills and games. The club will be held on Tuesdays through Thursdays from October to January. Grade 4 meets on Tuesday; grade 5 on Wednesday; and grade 6 on Thursday.

**After School Spring Sports-BC** — Co-ed 4th grade students will participate in a safe, fun, educational environment where they can expand their knowledge of various sports. Students will meet every Wednesday during the spring to cover a variety of sports and games.

**Blue and White Band-BC** — Students will rehearse and perform elementary band repertoire with an emphasis on ensemble sound and musicianship. Students will learn note reading, rhythm reading and other skills. The club will meet Tuesdays and Thursdays before school, beginning in September.

**Book Club-BC** — The students and the advisor will pick a book, spend the month reading it and meet at the end of the month to discuss it. They will then pick another book to read over the next 4 weeks. The club will meet 7 times from November to June.

**"E Pluribus Unum" Latin Club-BC** — 5th and 6th grade students will be taught useful Latin expressions as well as the history and culture of the Roman Empire. The club will meet on Tuesdays beginning February through May.

**French Club-BC** — Students will learn to speak conversational French and learn about the French culture. The club will be held on Tuesdays starting January and ending in February.

**Garden Club-BC** — Students will plant bulbs and annuals in school flowerbeds. Students will learn the names of the trees, shrubs and flowers that surround our school. Members will learn about the characteristics of weeds, root systems and the growth habits of plants. The students will maintain these plantings during the spring. In the event of inclement weather, videos and discussions about plants and gardening will be featured. The club will be held on Tuesdays starting Oct. 1st.

**Helping Hands Club -BC** — Students will participate in and help organize various volunteer activities throughout their school and community. Students will learn leadership skills and the importance of giving back to the community. The club will meet on Mondays beginning October 21 through December 9 from 3:30pm-4:30pm.

**Homework Club-BC** — Teacher-recommended students will be provided with a safe, quiet and structured environment to allow them to get a good start on their daily homework assignments. They will receive support and assistance to complete assignments and/or study for upcoming tests and quizzes. The club will meet every Monday, Wednesday and Thursday that school is in session.

**Panther Band-BC** — Students will rehearse beginning band repertoire, with an emphasis on musical goals and ensemble sound. The club will meet Fridays before school beginning in October.

**Running Club - Boys** — Students will participate in a safe, fun, educational environment where they can expand their knowledge of running and fitness. Grade 5 and 6 boys will be meeting after school to participate in a running club. The boys will be preparing for a 5k and following a program known as "Couch to 5K". Club will meet on Tuesday and Thursday from March through May.

**Running Club - Girls** — Grade 5 and 6 students will participate in a fun after-school club for girls who are interested in preparing for a 5K all girls' race. Any ability can join; your competition is yourself. Try to improve your own running ability. Our goal is for all club participants to finish the race. Club will meet from March through May; days of the week to be determined.

**Scrabble Club-BC** — Students will have the opportunity to develop vocabulary, spelling and spatial skills while playing Scrabble. The students will learn tips to improve play. The club will meet on Wednesdays beginning December 5th until February 27th.

**Study Skills Club-BC** — New to the Brass Castle clubs/activities this year is our Study Skills group. Developed for students who struggle with organization, how to properly prepare for class assignments, and how to best answer questions for assessment. Participation in this club is based on teacher recommendations. Students will learn a variety of study skills, which will include: Goal setting, organization of papers and time, develop strategies to ask questions, note taking skills, and how to study tips. The Study Skills Club will meet on Thursday mornings from Oct. to April.

**Talent Show** — Students will have an opportunity to tryout for the Talent Show in January 2014. Selected acts will perform their talent in a school-wide performance in March 2014.

**Video Club-BC** — Students in grade 6 will have the opportunity to participate in all phases of video production. They will write a news script, research news stories, produce, direct and provide the talent for a news-style broadcast for the school. The club will meet on Thursdays beginning October 17 and continue through March 27.

The weather for the next few days looks magnificent for our sixth graders who are off to Stokes for their camping trip. When I saw the students off on Wednesday morning, they were excited, energetic and happy. We should all be proud of their positive attitudes regarding their assigned 'cabin-mates' and for many, this is a milestone - their first official trip away from home. Thank you parents for trusting us to take care of your children and more importantly allowing your young ones the opportunity to spread their wings...

Each fall brings a plethora of activity in our schools. The first full week in October is designated by the State of NJ as the "Week of Respect." Though positive character is taught and reinforced all year, this week focuses on several specific initiatives. Port Colden School will once again embrace the well-loved and effective "Bucketfiller" Program." This concept is based on building a positive school environment by rewarding kindness and respect to others. The students begin to feel good about doing good and so they do good... a cycle that becomes a wonderful habit. Our 3<sup>rd</sup> graders are very familiar with this program and have been so excited for the official kick-off during the 'Week of Respect.' At Brass Castle, our older students will continue to strive for a S.T.A.R. nomination - for students who Show Tolerance And Respect. A STAR is earned when a student or staff member shows good character without being asked - maybe this means walking a young student down the hall, holding a door open, using manners with a bus driver or teacher or just being a kind person. The goal of this program is to encourage students to 'do good' when they think no one is watching... and isn't that what positive character is all about?

In our September Character Education classes, the focus has begun with our elementary students. The book *Chrysanthemum* is one of my favorites. Each student was given a pink heart, which said "Before you speak, think and be smart, it's hard to fix a wrinkled heart." Anytime, the character Chrysanthemum was teased, taunted or spoken to unkindly, students would fold their paper hearts; but when Chrysanthemum was feeling good about herself and being treated kindly, the heart would be unfolded. The moral of the story was that no matter how many times "I'm sorry" was spoken, no matter how many times the paper hearts were unfolded - there would ALWAYS be a wrinkle left behind. This sets the groundwork for future lessons that remind us all that our words are POWERFUL! Choose to be kind!
